


Humming and buzzing

People have been using wax and honey from bees for over a thousand years. But bees don't really need people at all — they are wild animals that nest in cavities in trees — and we need to protect them. To help us understand why bees are so important to the environment, the Wasmeier open air museum provides an overview of the history of beekeeping: from tree hollows at the forest's edge to beehives to brightly painted bee houses and bee boxes, which is what most beekeepers use today. And they also have a glass beehive for observing the industrious animals.
